5th Sunday after Epiphany

"'Sir, didst thou not sow good seed in thy field? How then does it have weeds' He said to them, 'An enemy has done this'" (GOSPEL).

The problem of evil is indeed a mystery. But the problem of good would indeed be a greater mystery, did not the good sees of "the word of Christ dwell" amongst us unto a "harvest" of "mercy, kindness, humility, meekness, patience" (EPISTLE); did not Jesus offer up today's "sacrifice of reparation" (SECRET) and give us a Sacrament "of salvation" (POSTCOMMUNION).
