Laetare Sunday with the commemoration of the 4th Sunday of Lent

"Jesus then took the loaves and ... distributed them to those reclining ... as much as they wished" (GOSPEL).

We all "wish" to be fed with joy, now and forever. The discipline of Lent may sadden our poor frail nature, so the Church analyzes the causes of true joy on this "Rejoice" or Laetare Sunday (INTROIT). The first source of genuine "joy" is a sincere Easter Confession; it emancipates us from the slavery of sin. We now enjoy the "freedom" of Christ's Gospel of love, because we have we have been freed from the "bondage" of that fear which prevailed in the days before Christ (EPISTLE).

The second source of genuine "joy" is a fruitful Easter Communion, for which proper preparation and thanksgiving have been made. The soul's instinctive hunger is satisfied by this personal communing with God. In the picture above, the Host and Chalice are seen descending upon men of all races. Humanity thus fed with Divinity, is joyously united in a real social and mystical union. Men will then work for one another in "a city which is compact together" (COMMUNION VERSE).
